Letter from Jeff Marlow, CEO



I want to thank our community for the warm welcome I have received in my new role as CEO of the Food Bank. I have had the pleasure of participating in this great mission for 14

years. I have learned that we can only accomplish our mission with solid relationships—relationships with our food providers, community-based feeding partners, and the community.

As you know, Oklahoma has a hunger issue. We are the nation's fifth-most food-insecure state, with one in seven Oklahomans struggling daily with hunger, including one in five kids. Oklahoma is last in the nation for fruit and vegetable consumption. I know when you hear the devastating stats, the problem seems overwhelming. But it's not. This is a solvable problem—a problem we can solve together with our partners and supporters.

The need continues to grow as resources continue to decrease for families. A recent Congressional report from the Joint Economic Committee stated that the average Oklahoma household would need an additional \$8,900 a year to afford the same goods and quality of life they had less than three years ago.

For many Oklahomans, it is not just a problem of having enough money to

buy food; there is often no place to buy healthy and affordable food. In many of our communities – often the poorest urban neighborhoods and the rural counties we serve – there are simply no decent food stores. Families living in these areas often rely on variety and convenience stores for their food.

There are brighter days ahead. Our commitment to our mission is stronger than ever. As we settle into our new expanded facility, our meal delivery count is up 20% compared to last year. The new Culinary Center can produce up to 15,000 fresh meals a day. We are committed not only to ensuring that no Oklahoman goes to bed hungry but that their bellies are full of nutritious food.

I love this organization and the importance of the mission. We have a lot of work ahead of us, but we have the vision and strategy to ensure no one goes hungry in our great state. We can't do it without you. Your insights, ideas, and support are crucial – and your partnership is priceless.

The Face of Hunger

HUNGER HIDES

Imagine living on the edge of survival, where every meal is a blessing, and every bill is a threat. Imagine having to choose between feeding your family or keeping them warm, healthy, and safe. This is the reality for one in seven Oklahomans who struggle with hunger and poverty every day. But they are not alone. They are part of our community, our network, our circle, and our family

Hunger hides. Though many of us may not realize the grave disparities that exist in our communities, people face hunger in every county in eastern Oklahoma. Sixty percent of Oklahomans live paycheck to paycheck, leaving many families one unexpected bill or incident away from falling off a financial cliff. These are our neighbors, coworkers, classmates, and even family members.



FOOD INSECURITY

Oklahoma remains one of the only five states with a food insecurity rate above 14.1%. Feeding America projects this number to climb to 22.5% in the coming years.



DAILY HUNGER STRUGGLE

One in five kids in Oklahoma struggles daily with hunger. Eastern Oklahoma is one of the nation's most food-insecure areas for children.



FINANCIAL CHALLENGES

44% of Oklahoma families lack adequate savings to cover basic expenses if they suffer a loss of stable income.




We have been feeding the families of eastern Oklahoma since 1981. Since then we have built lasting relationships with farmers, retailers, and other members of the community. We provide at least four food meals for \$1. Your dollar goes further because we leverage our relationships with the community.

The Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma distributes a lot of food. Last year, the Food Bank provided more than 22 million meals to families throughout the 24 counties we serve. As we continue the fight against hunger in eastern Oklahoma, we will need to provide thousands more meals to meet the increased need.

Food Bank's Capital Campaign Expansion Project Complete

The Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma's Build Hope Capital Campaign has successfully completed, with the final touches being added to the expanded facility. Here's what's new:

State-of-the-Art Kitchen: A spacious commercial kitchen equipped to efficiently prepare nutritious meals.

Ballroom and Event Space: A versatile space for community gatherings and events.

Demonstration Kitchen: Empowering families with meal planning skills through culinary education.

Enhanced Volunteer Area: An efficient workspace for volunteers, enabling the organization to serve more families with dignity.

Expanded Warehouse: Increased storage capacity and facilities to distribute 50 million pounds of food annually.

Partner Agency Store: A convenient shopping experience for partner agencies.

The Food Bank looks forward to using the additional space to address food insecurity in eastern Oklahoma and expresses gratitude to supporters for their ongoing compassion and support.

Food Bank Fills Gap after SNAP Cutbacks

In February 2022, emergency SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits from the pandemic expired. We witnessed a dramatic increase in people seeking help as a result. Not only were benefits cut, but food costs also continued to be much higher than pre-pandemic.

In response, we created additional emergency food boxes and held special distributions for people whose benefits were cut. We worked to connect people with a partner pantry near them. Our network of feeding partners throughout our 24-county service area ensures that our neighbors can access nutritious food near their homes or workplaces.

“Accepting help is something we all have to do at various points in our lives,” said Joy Ferrin, Vice President of Community Impact. “So, it’s not negative to access a food pantry or another food program,” she said.

The SNAP emergency allotments had been in place for a few years, and families were accustomed to that assistance. The cuts, paired with inflation, made putting food on the table challenging for many families. We host a Drive-through Pantry every third Thursday of the month to help fill the gap, with regular SNAP benefits coming at the start of the month. We are here and ready to serve our guests.





Building Resilient Communities

The Food Bank does more than sustainably increase access to food. We are successful because we are rooted in, responsive to, and respectful of local contexts. This efficient model, with more than 600 community-based feeding partners, increases food access and fills gaps when social protections are lacking or absent.

As resources continue to decline for Oklahoma families, our feeding partners are seeing the need to meet pandemic levels. Although the food that the Food Bank provides to pantries throughout eastern Oklahoma is up 20% from last year, it is not keeping up with demand. The lines of people needing support during the pandemic are still there—they have just gone inside.

An economic analysis report by a group of Congressional Republicans has found that the **average Oklahoma household would need to spend an additional \$739 a month, or about \$8,900 per year**, to afford the same goods and quality of life they had less than three years ago. A recent poll from CBS News shows that **53% of working families report being unable to meet expenses** or having just enough to get by. The Food Bank and our partners often serve as a bridge when working families fall on hard times. More than half of the visitors who rely on food banks are employed.

We are grateful for the commitment and passion of our partners to our mission. Together, we will ensure everyone in eastern Oklahoma, no matter their race, background or ZIP code, can have access to the food and resources they need to thrive. We will continue to find innovative solutions to meet the needs of those we serve.

Honored to Serve

Our culinary team works tirelessly throughout the year to ensure they provide delicious, healthy meals for those we serve. However, one day stood out amongst others — the day we had the opportunity to cook for Cherokee Warrior Veterans.

“It was an honor to cook for the Cherokee Warrior Veterans. I even had the privilege of taking a photo with two gentlemen who served in World War II,” said Jeff Marlow.

On Aug. 17, our culinary team cooked an on-site meal in Tahlequah to recognize the elite veterans. The Cherokee Nation Office of Veterans Affairs hosted the event. Approximately 50 veterans in attendance ranged in age from 75 to 97 years, with one veteran being 101 years old. All had served in foreign wars, including WWII, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War.

Our culinary team was thrilled to prepare and serve a full-plated meal with grilled steak, salad, roasted potatoes, dinner rolls, fresh vegetables, and a slice of cake for dessert. Marlow expressed his gratitude for being at the event. “Thank you to my Cherokee friends for allowing us to be part of such a special event honoring your veterans,” said Marlow. “We are proud to serve.”

Disaster Response

In the early morning hours of June 18, 2023, a storm with winds up to 100 miles per hour sped through the Tulsa metro ripping trees from their roots, downing lines, and blocking roads with debris. This left thousands without power.

No power means no refrigeration and lost food. We enacted our disaster response efforts to get food and water into the hands of our neighbors as quickly as possible.

On June 21, we held a special event providing fresh, hot cheeseburger meals and a box of food to take home. Staff and volunteers happily served more than 2,000 people on that day alone. There was such a need that we started loading cars a half-hour before the scheduled start time.

“We’ve prepared more meals in our kitchen this week than we had in the past month,” Matt Jostes, Chief Development Officer at the Food Bank, shared during the event. “So everybody’s really stepped up in the community to meet this need.”

Emergency food boxes were distributed throughout the power outage. We worked with several companies to source additional donations of water and get it to those in need. The essential water provided relief to the impacted community dealing with lost food, damaged property, and the intense heat.

We shared our website’s pantry finder feature with multiple media outlets, so help could be found through our network of feeding partners. We are on the front lines ready and willing to help when a disaster strikes.



Thanksgiving Meals Fed Families and Fed Hope

In fall 2022, food costs surged, straining family budgets and hindering celebrations. To address this, we aimed to provide 100,000 Thanksgiving meals. Food Bank staff, volunteers, and partners collaborated to pack traditional holiday food into Thanksgiving boxes, distributing them through four drive-through events. Despite chilly weather, volunteers enthusiastically loaded meal boxes and turkeys into families’ cars.

Tamie Sunagoowie shared just how grateful she was to have enough food to celebrate with her family. “I appreciate the community doing this,” said Sunagoowie. “It means a lot, we’ve lost so many family members over this last year, that we’re thankful to come together.”

The meals fed families as well as provided hope. Dana Maker went through the drive-thru at the Osage Casino to pick up a Thanksgiving meal. “I am excited, this is great. I appreciate it,” said Maker. “More than you all know!”

We are thankful to serve because everyone deserves a seat at the table.

Programs

FOOD FOR KIDS

Our Food for Kids programs serve children and families by focusing on underserved communities to provide access to nutritious food throughout the year. From our Mobile Pantries, School Pantries, Backpack for Kids program, and more, we fight childhood hunger daily.

VETERANS' FOOD PROGRAM

Military families make many sacrifices so their loved ones may bravely serve our country, but going without food should never be one of them. The Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma provides fresh and shelf-stable food to our service men and women and their families through our Veterans' Food Program.

SENIOR SERVINGS

The Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma's Senior Servings program focuses on keeping seniors healthy and strong.

The issue of hunger is especially challenging for seniors. Economic constraints can lead some seniors to eat less, skip meals, or face difficult decisions, like choosing between food or medications. The Food Bank works every day to assist seniors in getting the food they need.

RETAIL RESCUE

About 40% of food produced ends up in the garbage. The Retail Store Donation Program helps reduce waste and helps feed families in Oklahoma. The Food Bank works with local and national food manufacturers and stores to rescue this food and get it out to our 600-plus community-based food partners. In FY23, the Food Bank rescued more than 17 million pounds of food.

OKLAHOMA FARM TO TABLE

The Food Bank's Oklahoma Farm to Table program provides families with fresh and nutrient-dense fruits and vegetables while supporting local farmers. Oklahoma Farm to Table purchases fresh produce from local growers to provide for our neighbors struggling with food insecurity. This program benefits and strengthens our local food system while also offering a nutritious selection of seasonal fruits and vegetables to those we serve.

CULINARY CENTER

As the nation's first food bank to introduce an on-site professional kitchen, the Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma created the Culinary Center to prepare nutritious meals from perishable food that would otherwise be discarded. The new state-of-the-art Culinary Center is now capable of creating up to 15,000 fresh, healthy meals a day. These meals are served hot on the Mobile Eatery food trucks and are also preserved by freezing and then distributed by our Agency Partners.
